- Breakout 9:
- Facebook has changed how we experience the internet
 - Youtube!
 - KPop scene buying out tickets to the rally and organized to crash police feeds
 - Younger generations took over Social media groups to hijack tags and redirect information
 - Internet of Things - Impacts our security and our ability to be tracked (Smart Toaster xD)
 - Fandom scene changed - created more space for diverse voices, informal publication industry driven by women and queer folks
 - Harry Potter I - Striving for Social Change, Creating Space for Learning about Inclusive Writing
 - Twitter on both sides -- creates space for folks to have their voices heard, increases access to resources while also amplifying voices like Trump
 - Facebook is really powerful in how public health is being twisted -- covid conspiracies
 - Wikipedia -- Not corporate, run by volunteers, interesting way of sharing and accessing knowledge on the internet
 - Collective ownership of the platforms in the future, could change our relationship with the internet
 - Owning our own stories as a future use of the internet?
 - People are trying to figure out how to love to different platforms for file sharing and organizing? Instead of traditional platforms like Google Drive
 - How will we be able to make that switch and organize safely remotely?

A: long history in the labor movement, witnessed a Teamsters strike completed after posting contract online for public - what happens from 1997-forward? Convergence
 B: the rise of remote work + gig work - working remote for 7 years now and it causes total dependence on tech and existing proprietary systems, regardless of one's politics
 C: works remotely for nationwide org, doing Palestine advocacy - employees all in dif. timezones, dependent on Google Suite, Zoom, etc. consolidation of power on internet feels overwhelming when trying to use liberatory practices, but also trying to meet people where you're at
 D: IS A SUPERSTAR AND IS GOING INTO EIGHTH GRADE!!!! transitioning into online classes, but also dealing with a president who wants to push schools into being open - WTF?
 E: works for Asian Pacific American Labor Alliance, when considering the future, reminded of a special (John Oliver?) about facial recognition, which is so relevant right now with people at protests being targeted and later arrested, it's very on-point for white men, but inefficient for BIPOC people - dangerous, increasing racial profiling, in DC, when ppl tried to take down the Andrew Jackson statue, there were wanted posters with photos of protesters, contributes to policing and profiling.
 F: grew up on the internet and witnessed the transition from anonymous spaces to full identity online + the data that goes with it, thinking about tech being used by existing government systems - using facial recognition, using racist data for recidivism stats
 A: ubiquity of cameras - some places in the world, they're everywhere! esp. in UK, is it coming here, or here already? they're already using it! do we accept it or do we paint over the camera lenses?
 C: there was a battle between convenience v. anonymity - and the battle is over, we'll give you our data for ease, simplicity, is there any going back? the timeline showed that the Snowden revelations had little-to-no impact on consumption even though had significant news coverage, how do we come back?
 B: we're seeing the first generation of people whose lives were lived online coming of age in this context, too, with photos/documentation of those digital lives, and weren't given the opportunity to opt in, how will Gen Z impact this, esp. given their relationship to this tech?
 D: being online for school is so weird! when we talk, we gesticulate - use hand motions, to communicate fully, if school is about in-person interactions, it will complicate how we communicate with one another, develop relationships, and the total cognitive dissonance of gov. saying everything will be fine with kids going to school, while we know better?
 children ARE dying of covid-19.
 A: this is such a hard time to be making those transitions, the parents need to be more understanding.
 D: yeah! I have a lot of friends saying their parents don't understand what we're going through - but maybe we can help them understand? and it's frustrating that we've all moved to life online, without being able to take the option of IRL life.
 C: reminds me of the tech gap - some people grow up with tech access, but not everyone did.
 F: Philly organizers are trying to push Comcast to provide free web access to all students this fall, which has been a long-time campaign, the future of tech that I want would include removing capital and profitability from the equation, why do we have to pay for internet, for tech resources?

Past > Loss of Net Neutrality

Past > After Social Media algorithms started altering what we see

Future > COVID era of mixed type meetings (online and offline) is big learning curve

Future > Real time interpretation is improved and widely available, will increase accessibility, decrease exclusion

Future > Fiber: When uploading is accessible as downloading, allowing for people to put out media at the same rate that we intake it

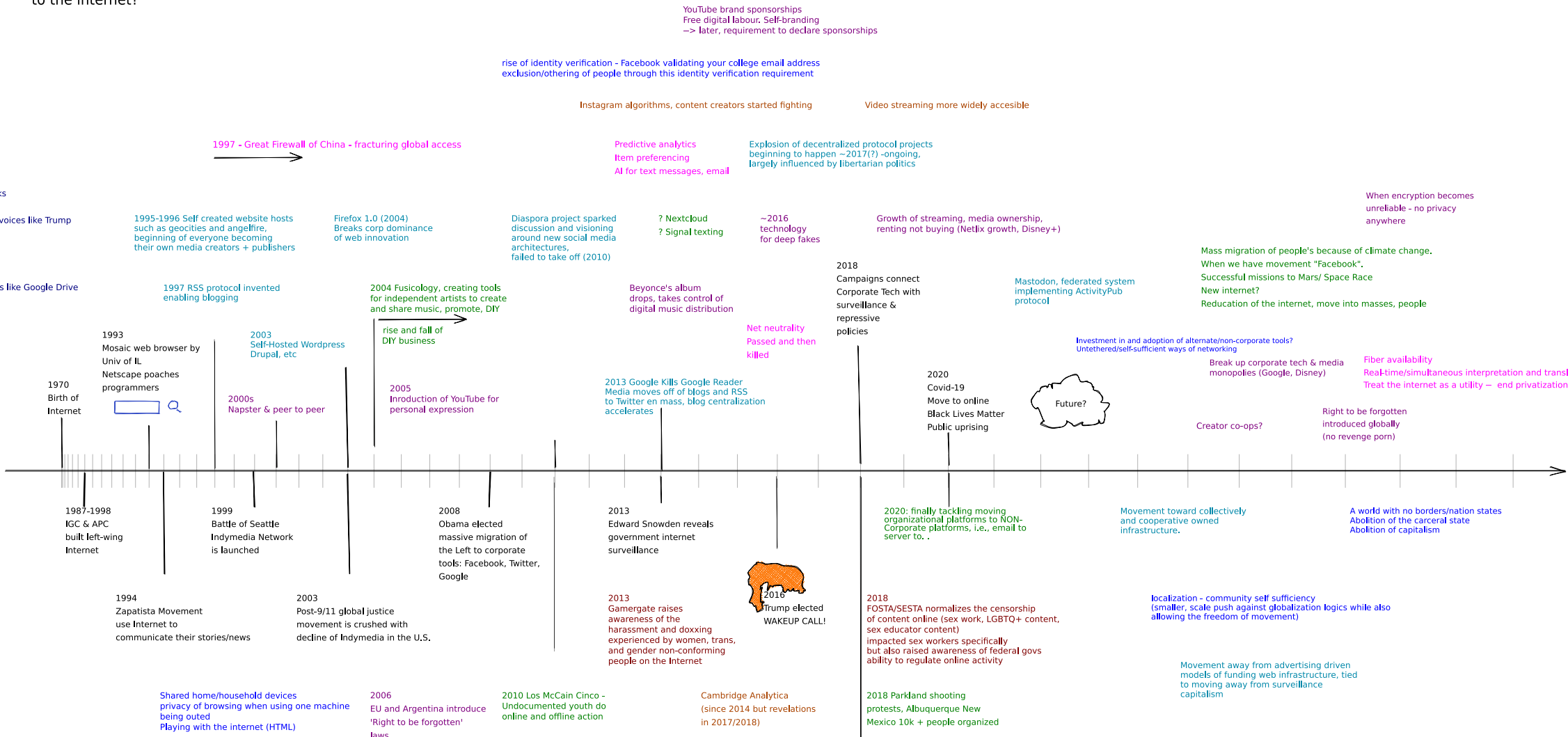
Future > internet de-privatized, Regulated and widely available like a utility (bring back net neutrality)

Future > continue developing alternatives to corporate and proprietary softwares, supporting and funding POC developers and tech folk

Past > 90's Clinton/Gore put lots of resources into building 'info super highway', this cyber-libertarian vision of internet that Newt Gingrich was also jazzed about - in the 90's, projects and funding for building out internet was rooted in white supremacy.

Future > how can we make tech accessible to un-housed folk, if they don't have battery power, access to connectivity, or may not know how to use certain tech, Public Libraries are a good resource, and are starting to address these issues, but these projects are under-funded, under-developed.

Future > the US needs to look to other nations who are offering free and regulated internet successfully



chatrooms, egalitarian convening that 'anyone' can join

Personal - proliferation of personal devices (getting a cell phone, having a device at all times, SMS services)

Mythology of more privacy with your own personal device
 Obscuration of your identity online; making up who you are

Expansion of the carceral system / privatization
 Centralized criminal databases and tracking
 Alongside rise of internet usage and eventually creation of identity mapping/linkage

technological takeovers of cities - gentrification, houselessness

people realizing that their phones were platforms for surveillance

Black-made media allowing for streaming without a paywall

2021 - badass encrypted feministbook launches and the left moves over to that for organizing

Discussion: what will it take to cause the jump to fully encrypted, fully open source, securely configured hardware? -we need a solution that meets people's needs (they are on Facebook bc of need for community, for example) -taking it one thing at a time.- build up layers of security by slowly replacing one tool at a time - ex: start with a listserv moving from Google Groups to an alternative -start getting small groups of friends to become "secure pods" and shift communications to Signal -the corporate internet is NEW - it's only been around for ~10 years - we can get rid of it! -although the physical elements of the internet have always been corporate or government -can we build autonomous internets? mesh networks? where do these fit in? regional internets? (Travel for internet tourism?)

GENERAL NOTES
 - Ways people have used the internet to connect
 - Internet porn, queer porn, fanfiction - building infrastructures that are not corporate ones
 - people hit walls and all say we're going to leave facebook, but then don't end up abandoning -- ello, mastodon, diaspora, the corporate platforms having this corporate-driven ease of use, how do either not need that ease, or get it.

FUTURE
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 - the re-election of trump and the new law enforcement will cause a lot of events that will definitely impact the internet
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 - these companies all started as rebel youth, because corporate tools, protect against inevitable corruptibility.
 - we are in jobs and not communities, activism is making community, not profitable, in jobs, money is focus, people are replaceable.
 -re: UBI, we're all testing the excaidraw, you need a lot of people to use it and test it. these kinds of things could totally change the internet.
